"From Eunuchs to Transsexuals: Scientific Modernity and Sex Change in Twentieth-Century China"

For much of Chinese history, the eunuch stood out as an exceptional figure at the margins of gender categories. Amid the disintegration of the Qing Empire (1644-1911), men and women in China began to understand their differences in terms of modern scientific knowledge. In this seminar, Howard Chiang traces the genealogy of sexual knowledge from the demise of eunuchism to the emergence of transsexuality, exploring how competing definitions of sex circulated in science, medicine, vernacular culture, and the periodical press in the first half of the twentieth century.
